

How Daddy Was Always Late

Contexts

The story 'How Daddy Was Always Late' is a humorous account that many students around the world will relate to. The narrator's father has a lifelong problem of being late to everything. As a child, he loved reading books but detested schoolwork. His habit of reading books till late at night would cause him to be sleepy and late to school every day.

Alexander Borisovich Raskin's story is a children's tale. Stories or poems of this kind are meant for children and often have child characters themselves. Such stories often include interesting, adventurous or funny incidents and characters that the child comes across. They are full of vivid details and make use of descriptive language. These features give readers a chance to experience the same things as the characters in the story.

Summary

The story tells us how the narrator's father grows up to be late all the time. As a child, Daddy is late to school every day. Every evening when Grandma calls Daddy to finish his homework, he is busy reading. He asks for a little more time to just finish one more page of his book. But at the end of each page, he starts a new one! When he finally sits down to do his homework, he is sleepy and manages to finish his homework in a daze. In the morning, he asks for a little more time in bed and is not able to reach school in time.

Since the narrator's father does his homework half-heartedly and is often late, he finds it hard to understand his lessons in class. Thus, he grows up to be late all the time and spends his life hurrying to catch up.

Perspectives

- Daddy asks for a second whenever he is called to do his homework or to wake up in the morning. It seems like such a small and common habit, but the effect it has on him in the long run is huge.
 - Can you think of any other such small things in life which make a lot of difference to people's lives?
 - Is there a small thing in your life which you could work on to make a big change?

- Daddy was always tempted to turn the page and continue reading. He would do this even when he knew he had other important tasks to finish.
 - What are some of your hobbies that you find difficult to take a break from?
 - How can you make sure you prioritize your tasks and spend your time wisely?
- Just like Daddy, many people have trouble waking up early in the morning, especially school kids. Some people find it easier to work and get better results at different times in the day.
 - When do you find yourself most active and keen to work?
 - How would you feel if school began in the afternoon or evening?
- Daddy would grow sleepy by the time he was ready to do his homework and would also oversleep in the mornings.
 - Find out about sleep cycles. Learn how much sleep a person needs on average, how one can sleep well and be active as soon as one wakes up, and so on.

Higher Order Thinking Skills

- 1. At the end of the story we find that Daddy was late to things even as an adult and he lost many opportunities because of his habit. How do you think he felt when such things happened? What thoughts could he have had about his own habit of always being late?
- 2. Do you think Daddy ever regretted his habit of being late? Imagine that Daddy changed his ways and became better at managing his time when he was young. In what ways do you think this would have affected his life?

Language in Use

Vocabulary

A. Derivative Words

Divide the class into four teams. Your teacher will give out sheets with a table of derivative words. Each team should take turns to try to form one sentence each with a verb and its derivative words (four sentences per row). When a team successfully makes four sentences with the words from a row, it will gain four points and claim that row. That particular verb and its derivatives cannot be used by other teams. If a team makes an incorrect sentence, it does not get points and that row can be used by another team. In this way all ten verbs and their derivative words will be used. The team that gets the highest points wins.

B. Words Easily Confused

Work in groups of five. Your teacher will give each group a set of cards and a dictionary. First, find another word from the dictionary that can be confused with the word you have. For example, *dual* and *duel*. Then, look up the meanings of the words from the dictionary. Finally, create an illustration of the word your teacher gave you. Display your words and the illustration for the class to have a look at.

Grammar

Have to, Used to, Need, Dare

Divide the class into five groups. Discuss and make four sentences with *have to*, *used to*, *need* and *dare*. Take turns to speak out your sentences in class. For each correct sentence a group will get two points and for each incorrect sentence one negative point. The team with the most correct sentences wins.

Appreciation

The story tells us that even though Daddy was late, 'Time marched steadily on'. Assigning human-like qualities to animals or any non-living objects used in poems or stories is called personification. Sometimes an abstract idea, that is, an idea or a concept which cannot be touched or seen can also be personified. Here, the abstract concept of 'time' is personified as a marching soldier.
